## ***Session Descriptions***

***YA Book Talks:*** The return of a favorite session from last year! YA public librarian Christina Getrost will share new middle/high school titles you can add to your purchase list.

***Project Connect:*** Follett's Project Connect partnered with Future Ready Schools to incorporate libraries into the Future Ready Framework. Their goal is to inspire, motivate, and encourage every school to connect its library program and professionals with all areas of education. They share their mission with educational leaders everywhere, determined to shed light on strong libraries while helping others find the best solutions to questions about technology, digital content and effective teaching and learning.

***One Book, One Community:*** The idea of a community, city, or state-wide book club focused on a common title is becoming a popular way of creating a shared experience and inspiring discussion amidst peers. Cassie Rondinella will present her experience facilitating a school-wide reading program.

***Elementary Book Talks:*** After the success of our YA Book Talk session last year, we had requests for an Elementary level session. Children's public librarian Trish Saylor will share new elementary titles your students will love.

***Genrefication:*** More and more school libraries are moving to genrefication- organizing books by genre, rather than author name or Dewey decimal number. Two of NEOnet's member librarians who have completed the process in their libraries will discuss pros and cons, suggestions, and effect on circulation.

***AASL Best Apps:*** The Best Apps for Teaching & Learning is a recognition honoring apps of exceptional value to inquiry-based teaching and learning as embodied in the American Association of School Librarians' *Standards for the 21st-Century Learner*. One of the 2016-17 Committee members, Susan Mongold, will present the 2016 selections.

***Vendor Presentation:*** Andrea Eshelman, Gale Cengage Education Consultant, will share Future-Ready Collaboration solutions utilizing the content in the Gale Resources to work more closely with teachers in your building.

***Maker Spaces Panel:*** Considering adding a maker space to your library? Bring your questions and concerns to this panel, featuring a school and a public librarian who have experience planning, constructing, and running community creation centers.

***Copyright Panel:*** If you need a refresher on copyright to act as your building expert or have specific questions as students now collaborate online more frequently, this is your panel. Two copyright and fair use experts from local universities will review the basics and take questions.
