Technical Training

A+ Certification – Currently, there is no need for A+ Certification.

Securly – Proof of Concept – We have 7 or 8 so far, biggest issue now is SSL only sites. There is a configuration issue. NEOnet scheduled a call with Securly on February 7th to discuss issues. Also, single sign on does not work with Firefox - only Chrome and Internet Explorer.

20G Fiber – We moved to dark fiber between our location and the DR (Disaster Recovery) site. Dark fiber provides more bandwidth and future possibilities to expand.
